PRESIDENT'S REPORT FOR NOVEMBER.










The tour will be a progressive tour covering about 520Klm over four days with regular regroups and open to all **Veteran** cars.

Keith and Anne Bartley had their Star and Wally and Bev Lanagan had their Oakland on display and attracted the attention of the special guests who spent time chatting with them.







"In the Sydney (Australia) suburb of Surry Hills locals have noticed a giant sized billboard has just gone up on a famous old theatre advertising the new De Dion Bouton for sale. But here is the back story.

VCCAQ members Paul and Helen Blake have a very talented niece Kirsten Siddle who is involved in live theatre and has her own production company and who with her partner Scott Maidment has lately been restoring an old Sydney theatre to its former glory which is called the "Grand Electric".

As part of the restoration they engaged an artist Max Elbourne to revive the look with some appropriate murals and age related advertising.

Kirsten and Scott were standing on the front footpath with Max one morning discussing what might be the subject of the main billboard for the front entrance of the building.

In her own words Kirsten tell the story;-

"I had received a video of my Uncle's recently completed restoration of the 1906 De Dion Bouton just the day before. I showed the video to Max and he agreed it was a perfect fit!
