

National 1 & 2 Cylinder, Queensland

Members' Motors - Glenn Adams - 1915 Napier

History:

Purchased new in Melbourne, Australia from Hunter & Glennon on July 7th 1915. It is believed the body was built by the Flood Motor Co. of Melbourne.

The vehicle was purchased by Mr T Harvey of Craigieburn, Victoria. The car was used until 1936, when it was stored.

In the 1960's, after Mr Harvey's death, the car was passed to a nephew, Mr C Hume. Mr Hume had the car repainted and the original trim restored. A new canvas hood and side curtains were fitted, along with some electrical and mechanical work.

Following Mr Hume's death, the car was sold to Mr Doug Mullins of Adelaide in 1988.

Following Mr Mullins death in 2006, the car was passed to his stepson Mr Glenn Adams of Adelaide/Mt Gambier, now Mt Mellum Qld.

This wonderful 102 year old vehicle has belonged to only two families since new. (Harvey/Hume and Mullins/Adams). It has covered only 25,000 miles since new.

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The RACQ 1094 Rambler

The 1904 "G" Model Rambler originally owned by Dr Marks set the fastest time for a single cylinder vehicle climbing Edward Street in 1904. This record still stands today as Edward Street is now one way down. The photos of the Rambler were taken when it was on display at the RACQ Edward Street Building.

What Car is This?

From the Archive Royal Automobile Club, shares an insight into the earliest days of motoring exhibitions from the Club's archive

The Edwardian automobile often arrived in a cloud of dust thrown up from the road surface. In a bid to abate the prevalence of dust on roads, experiments took place throughout the world to find a solution, with varying degrees of success.

In 1902, sections of the Promenade des Anglais, Nice, were surfaced with coal tar. Rather unfortunately, the heat of a sunny July in the South of France and the effects on other forms of transport, were not considered. Initially, horses slipped and fell, their stability greatly compromised by dust carried on carriage wheels from other untreated roads, which adhered to the newly tarred surface. This created another layer of debris for motorists to contend with instead of stabilising the original terrain as hoped. Eventually, the tarred sections also melted to form a paste. It was decided that further experiments should be undertaken somewhere less congested and the Touring Club of France donated 500Fr towards tar tests in a cooler climate.



Californians had slightly more success with their oil solution. The oil mixed well with dirt and gravel, which hardened to a smooth, asphalt-like surface. Pre-1902 experiments at Golden Gate Park, San Francisco, were mixed, but it was generally acknowledged that oil on American roads was an improvement to sprinkling water only, which had to be distributed frequently.

Unrefined petroleum was the most popular dust retainer, but the quality of the product differed greatly. Crude petroleum did not ignite easily and it consolidated any ballast on the roads. The infrequency of application also made it appeal to cash strapped councils in England. In 1902, Hampton Wick District Council sent their representative Mr. Pullman, to consult with the Automobile Club of Great Britain and Ireland and the Automobile Club de France, to find a remedy for Surrey's roads. Crude petroleum seemed to be the way forward, however, Club representatives omitted to tell Mr. Pullman that it had one drawback...it stank for several hours until the odour fizzled out or the residents stopped noticing it. Surely, the healthiest roads could be found in Algeria where the mixture consisted of Naphtha and good quality olive oil.

PLEASE DO YOUR PART!



FOR SALE

VETERAN/EDWARDIAN "WATFORD" SPEEDOMETERS by NICOLE NIELSEN LTD.

HISTORY: London watchmakers Nicole Nielsen & Co. Ltd. took up the manufacture of automotive instruments in 1904 at their Watford premises, giving rise to the "Watford" brand under which they were sold. The Nicole Nielsen name appears on their instruments. In 1917 the war brought about changed circumstances and Robert North (a part owner of NN) took over the automotive business under the name of North & Sons, whose name now appeared on their instruments. That's handy for enthusiasts, as we can be fairly certain that a Nicole Nielsen instrument is 1917 or earlier, and thus veteran or Edwardian, if you like.

SPEEDO #1: This is a complete and working Nicole Nielsen & Co. Ltd. "Watford" Model 716 brassbodied 0-60mph speedo with four windows for the odometer plus a single window for tenths of a mile). Maybe the tenths might be helpful on navigation runs. The body incorporates a brass mounting flange. It's an excellent example of the type of speedo that was on the market in the years before WW1.

I haven't been able to test the speedo but the very clever chap I use for repairs has examined it and sees no reason why it wouldn't work correctly. No attempt has been made to clean or restore the speedo, but I believe it will respond nicely to some TLC. **Price: \$400**
