

Russell reported that the next event will be the 60th Anniversary Lunch at the Carina Leagues Club next Saturday and anybody wishing to attend needs to pay Hazel tonight as the numbers are being phoned through in the morning.

This will be followed by the Veteran and Vintage Swap on August 20th. As usual only V & V parts and accessories and the usual sausage sizzle with a gold coin entry.

The final event in the 60th Anniversary Tours will be 17th to the 23rd September in Stanthorpe to be known as the Savoring Stanthorpe Second Series Tour (SSSS Tour). Russell outlined the program as printed in the newsletter. Rally HQ will be the Top of the Town Caravan Park where most entrants are staying.

Motion Treasurer's Term

The new clause 12(3) to read; A member can hold the position of President, Vice President or Secretary for up to but no more than 3 years consecutively or the position of Treasurer for up to but no more than 5 years consecutively. Where a member fills one of these positions part way through a year because of a casual vacancy, that part year does not count towards the time served in the position for the purposes of this rule. Seconded by John Day.

Peter outlined the reasons for this change and suggested that there would be no problem having them approved by the department as there is no limit on time served in the model rules. He also foreshadowed the need for an Assistant Treasurers role to learn the system with the possibility of moving to the Treasurer's role at a later time. There was some debate for the motion and as there were no speakers against the Chairman put the motion to the vote. Carried 33 to one against with 4 abstentions.

Hazel raised the possibility of forming a social committee to organise a couple of social functions at the clubrooms each year, Glynn added that we have had them in the past and have run all social occasions.
