





President's Report for the 2013-2014 Year

Firstly, your Club has gone beyond being a minor recreational or hobby club whose principal function was to provide facilities for those who wish to participate in motoring in ancient motor cars. Rest assured, that desire is still there but we have moved on from there to become a Club with diverse activities including the ownership of property, the successful letting of same to other organisations and the consequent obligations that property demands.

There are now over 200 members whose needs require management and, fortunately, the administration and financial management functions have evolved into a capable pair of our lady members, Hazel Burley and Rhonda Guthrie, who can answer most of the questions most of the time. In this respect also our ability to access expert and seasoned financial advice from Robert Lovell has been of considerable help in developing a sound financial management system. An investment in a new computer and other necessary equipment have been acquired. While this has been happening the members of the Club's "Strategic Advisory Group", (using the acronym SAG for obvious reasons) has been beavering away addressing a list of factors and perceived needs which have led to recommendations to the Club's committee for consideration and, if worthy, entry into the Club's register of By-Laws which lists, for the first time, an identifiable set of policy matters directing the Club's efforts in the right direction. The pursuit of directions like the long range future of the Club's investment property, the house on our frontage to Old Cleveland Rd, need a little bit of sophisticated touch before we take the plunge to either scrap it, or totally rebuild what was really a hovel which should have been condemned. Having done the work we reckon the investment rental return should make it a good thing.

Having reached this point, where we have an ongoing need for financial expertise as well as the physical parts of an association with expanded property management, it seems clear to me that the whole could be joined to one responsibility of property management, run by a sub-committee of members with a responsibility for all aspects of all property matters: maintenance, repairs and renewals, tenancies, other rentals and enquiries. Such a structure, with adequate personnel, would ease the pressure on existing people and develop a wider set of skills.

Generally, I believe your elected Committee have performed well although some longer absences have made some things a little difficult at times. I feel your committee is too numerically small and I would urge this meeting to increase the number so as some existing positions may function better in the things they/he/she do. Additionally there are sub-committees not operating as well as we should expect, particularly those relating to the gathering of information about what is happening in other areas of recreational motoring.

We in VCCAQ are probably the oldest club, probably the most harmonious club, and probably the most social and congenial club in Queensland, but we fall short in our knowledge of what goes on in other sectors. We don't seek information about what others are doing, we have no structure to acquire information or intelligence about our environment or Government sensitivities. As dull as these items may seem, they are real, they are here to stay, and it may reward us well to keep in mind that having rich and powerful friends may be amongst our most valuable assets.

The social activity in the Club is excellent, seems to be well structured with a lot of contact on a very cordial base, many members belonging to separate groups because of some common bond. The "Diners" group, who grace the fine dining area of the veranda during the couple of hours prior to our regular monthly meetings, have become something of an institution where all manner of things can be learned, or displayed. Observers tell me that this function, with its capacity for mildly lubricated tonsils, can make or break a Chairman's determination into fragments.

Reference to the inside cover of the monthly newsletter (VT for short) will show a good number of sub-committees, listing a particular area of interest and consist of:

"Dating Committee" which fills an important part of what we need to have our cars authenticated and comprising experienced members.

"VT editor" Carolyn Robinson, who would rather be a publisher so long as she does not have to be a reporter, or is it the reverse of that? Carolyn is always looking for publishable material for inclusion in VT and would appreciate your help.

"Club Historian" Denis Martin, is Club Historian with a passionate interest in small French cars, as well as giving his expertise as an ordained Clergyman, from time to time. Denis's vocation has been called upon more than once this year, he officiating at the funeral service of a number of our members.

"Property Director" David Hackshall has control and direction of the grounds maintenance and fixed assets of the Club and who, with brother Michael, led the transformation of our rental house from hovel to haven.

"Webmaster", Peter Ransom, a former IT professional in another life, this year completed an updated revision of the Club's web site to what you see today.

"Ëvents". those places and times when we get to drive the cars, in places and times as far apart as Shepparton and Toogoolawah. Russell Massey has a sub-committee comprised of whoever else he can get to help him. This is Russell's first year, with a workload said to be a balance. In relation to all the factors which should be taken into account, Russell has done very well.

There are more sub-committees, particularly the SAG group which warrant our activities. People here are experienced, with wide knowledge in the workings of private business, amongst other things. The formation of SAG, with its single purpose, has given direction to the Club executive on a long term basis.

It was only the circumstances prevailing at the time, in the last hours before the AGM that I decided to accept nomination for the job. I believe we have done just that and I thank them all for their assistance. At this particular time I am enjoying better health than any other for quite some time and that certainly helps. I am most grateful.

I especially want to thank my wife, Val, for her patience, understanding and assistance to me during the year. She also has learned to place a high value on the friendship made and retained, a giant leap forward for now and beyond. We look forward to many more years of happy membership.

Now I have recently been involved in one. I somewhat sorrowfully sold my little M-type MG "Midge" to my friend Tony who has been chasing it for five years. I was sorry to see the efforts of 3+ years converting it from a very dilapidated "Kit Form" to a usable car go. We had it on a few runs and it was an enjoyable little fellow but of late due to the progress of anno domino I wasn't comfortable driving it especially in heavy traffic so it just sat in the garage.

Tony is an enthusiastic MG owner with a penchant for knowing the history of his cars, so he started delving into Midge's history. During the restoration I had acquired from the late Bernie Keating a genuine handbook for the M-type and the title page gave an owner's name as A.B. Gillespie of Albion plus an engine number for the car. Tony tracked A.B.G. and finally found a son who remembered his father's MG and even had photographs of him in the car, which he brought to the recent MG concours to show us, and also have the opportunity to meet us.

Prior to this Tony had found reports that A.B.G. had twice been fined for speeding in a Morris Minor in the late twenties and that he had entered an MG in a hillclimb in 1931.

Now for the coincidence - Tony checked with the Triple M people in England and found that the engine number quoted in my handbook was the one of the engine fitted to car number 1524 which happened to be Midge's car number. So apparently the book originally belonged to him. Tony is continuing the research. The car appears to be the first MG entered in competition in Queensland.

Midge's departure created some spare space in the garage so I have set up a hobbies area. At present I am "restoring" various model cars to create more dust collecting objects to put on shelves!

I bought a pair of steel shelves to clear some of the confusion in the workshop. I didn't realise until I undid the box containing the two of them that these were only 1270mm high. This turned out to be great as they don't stop the light coming through the back wall.

I did first what is usually done last, and read the instructions, which I carefully followed. "Yesterday I was looking for a picture on the internet and stumbled upon this old sepia shot of the main street of Jacksonville, Florida in 1911. The cars are interesting.

In front on the left is a Buick "White Streak". The model was named after a successful white painted racing car that the company campaigned in 1908. Unfortunately white paint colour had only just been developed and was very unstable. In a remarkably short time the paint ran and the colour blemished so badly that this model Buick soon became known as the "grey streaky". It would be many years before anybody was bold enough to paint motor cars white again.

Behind the Buick is a brand new Ford. Notice how the owner parked it with the wheels turned into the gutter. This held the car stationary while it was being crank started. The handbrake held the gears in neutral, but if the pawl on the brake handle was worn or not set correctly, the brake could disengage itself, automatically engaging high gear and running over the person doing the cranking.

Behind the Ford is a Northern which would have been at least 8 years old when the picture was taken. The wonky angle of the front left hand wheel suggests that the poor thing is well past its use by date.

The car on the right of the picture is a strange looking thing that I am having difficulty identifying. The only cars I know of that had 36" wheels were the Oldsmobile "Limited" and the American Underslung. This chassis is definitely not underslung so I will go for the Olds, although the back mudguards are slightly different
