This fuel news talks about petrol volatility and its relevance to vehicle and retail site operations.

GOOD VOLATILITY AND EVAPORATION OF PETROL IS ESSENTIAL FOR EASY STARTING AND SMOOTH DRIVING IN COOLER TEMPERATURES

In cooler seasons petrol is blended to vaporise easily in the vehicle engine. As the weather warms, petrol that vaporises too easily will form vapour in the fuel system. For this reason petrol is blended so that the tendency to form vapour (volatility) is less in summer than in winter. With the change from summer to winter petrol volatility is increased to ensure that vehicles can start and perform as expected. Various state environmental protection agencies also enforce a low volatility in summer for air quality reasons.

The tendency of petrol to vaporize is controlled by industry specifications that change monthly. These specifications take into account monthly average ambient temperatures so that in the coldest and hottest months petrol has the appropriate volatility to enable vehicles to start and operate safely under all expected temperature conditions.

Where temperature conditions are different to those expected, usually a longer period of hot weather later in autumn or the early onset of summer into spring then the higher temperatures can cause problems in retail sites where the petrol has been manufactured for use at a cooler temperature.

These show themselves as issues with suction pumps where the pumps rely on generating lower line pressure to move the petrol.

Under these conditions the petrol can boil in the lines generating a vapour and liquid mixture that is harder to move so the pumps slow down or stop.

The solutions are to cool the lines to reduce the temperature and to maintain a higher volume in the tanks so that the pumps have less work to do. The higher volume also reduces the exposure to high temperatures from tank walls and lines.

In periods of unusual hot weather in Autumn and Spring suction pumps can experience slow flow issues due to vapour and this will depend on tank location , layout and other factors.


