

Two more are currently under restoration, one of which is in New Zealand. (Taken from Bob Lamond's International Catalogue of Brush Owners' Vehicles, 2016.) It is a 1907 Brush Model B Runabout. It was preceded by a very short production run of Model As that had a friction drive. My Brush is the early version of a B with the lighter transmission and differential. These were upgraded in the later version later in the same year"

My advice to all long-suffering wives, Don't ask him for to choose If he loves his car or you the most I'll tell you now.....you'll lose.


I've decided not to fight it. He's just a hopeless case. I've given up the battle And accepted second place.

The event was abandoned and the course subsequently shortened to less than half its former length.


