

CONCESSIONAL REGISTRATION INFORMATION

Just to refresh Members' memories about concessional registered vehicles, here is how to access reading material on the subject provided by the Queensland Government in the Special Interest Vehicle Concession Scheme Guide.

The website is:- https://www.qld.gov.au/transport/fees/registration/special-interest/restrictions

A question was raised by a member regarding insurance on a concessional registered vehicle being driven by other than the owner. On talking with a TMR (Transport and Main Roads) representative there was no problem with the third party insurance however there could be with the comprehensive insurance policy.

There are policies that cover anyone driving the vehicle and others that require the drivers to be nominated on the policy. Beware if you are driving a vehicle covered by the latter type of insurance policy that in the case of an accident the vehicle may not be covered. This applies to all vehicles comprehensively insured. A suggestion is to check your policy to see what applies.

THE ORIGIN OF VETERAN TORQUE

Thanks to **Greg Hill** for the following.

"I was wondering if many people know about the origin of "Veteran Torque"?

In 1966 I was still at High School but had become friends with Ron Griffiths and Scott Goodsir. Their sons John and Richard also went to the same High School as I did.

Scott and his wife Lorna decided to act as Editor for a club magazine. Griffo had a duplicating machine, so we all got together and printed a magazine and it was titled Number 1 (I still have a copy).

We sold copies to the public at the start of the George Gilltrap Rally at Hyde Park at Yeronga in 1966.

I had gone to some club meetings at Ipswich (every second meeting was at Ipswich RSL Hall), but Griffo advised me not to pay my fees until the start of the next financial year. I think Scott continued with the magazine for a few years.

By 1970/71 I was on the committee and think I was the first Property Officer when the club leased the hall at Milton. Then I was Dating Officer and helped with organising events and social activities.

In 1973, John Griffiths was Events Chairman and Malcom Sypher was the Social *Organiser*. The club's Annual Dinner and presentation of trophies was arranged to be held at The River Room at the Hamilton Hotel on 28 September 1973. Derek Smith was the Club Magazine Editor at this time. The committee decided the club needed a name for the magazine and to hold a competition, and the winner would receive free tickets to the club Christmas function. It was a good prize as the tickets at \$6.00 per head were not cheap for a quality meal and a 5 piece band.

And the winner was - Malcom Sypher with "Veteran Torque".

Reminiscences from the current Editor.

How technology has changed. In 1966 I was working at Adelaide University in the Botany Department initially using a very old Underwood typewriter. We then progressed to the IBM electric 'golfball' machine. In mid-1980 we acquired one of the first computers to come into the Uni. – in our case an IBM Displaywriter 6580 with a 16-bit computer and a large disk inserted into the side – and of course no instructions, no internet / Google to look anything up, - just teach yourself.

Fast forward to August 1996. By now Alan and I had moved to Queensland and joined the Veteran and Vintage Clubs and the QVVA and were editors of *Vintage News* from August 96 – July 97, duplicating and collating the magazine on the small pool table in our "Granny Flat".

I took on the position of Editor of *Veteran Torque* in May 2006 from the late John Stewart – and still going.....

CHILL OUT IN CHINCHILLA Thursday 16th to Sunday 19th March 2023



After a disappointment in April 2022 as Mother Nature showed her hand with flooding in the Chinchilla area Keith and Anne, Wally and Bev have again put their organising to the test to come up with what we consider to be 4 days of rallying to suit all veteran vehicles. The roads are fairly quiet and flat. We will endeavour to show the rural landscape to its best, give a glimpse of history and several local industries

Rally headquarters will be the Chinchilla Tourist Park where some powered sites and Cabins have been reserved to early February. Two car spaces are adjacent to each cabin. There is a nominated area on site to park trailers. The park is on the Eastern entrance to town at 264 Zeller St. Chinchilla. When phoning for reservation on 07 46691465 mention the Veteran Vehicle rally.

Meals. -

Meals will be available each day on the runs but some evening meals will be your own responsibility. The Tourist park has a restaurant and there are dining opportunities in the town. Rally Dinner is on **Saturday** evening at the Tourist Park. Cost will be \$25 each, paying at the venue. BYO drinks.

Thursday evening - Dinner at Charley's Creek near Chinchilla business centre. (Braithwaite St) Take a stroll along the creek, check out the camp ground, yarn around the huge camp fire: join in a presentation & question time about Wagyu beef production; enjoy slow cooked beef brisket with campfire roasted vegetables and salad in the camp kitchen.

Cost will be \$25 per head. subsidized by VCCA(Q)- Please pay this amount to the Rally Reserve Account before 8th March to make payment easier for all.

Morning teas are your own responsibility and you need to bring chairs each day.

Period Dress: Although our members enjoy dressing in their special costumes the farm tour may not be really suitable - optional for you to decide.

Closing date for entries. Entries to be in by 8th March to enable caterers to provide meals.



For the sake of your hearts, (and the unavailability of some of the ingredients), you will not be served a meal similar to that shown on the right, however you can be assured of an excellent 3-course Dinner at the Hotel Settlers.

On the evening of April 14, 1912, the 324 FIRST-CLASS passengers sat down for a sumptuous meal. . This was a grand affair and included starters of canapés and oysters, a second course of consommé Olga (a clear veal soup garnished with scallops), a third course of poached salmon with mousseline sauce, and a fourth of filet mignons Lili or chicken Lyonnaise with marrow farci (stuffed vegetables). Mains catered to most people's tastes; lamb, duckling and beef, with buttery roast potatoes, boiled potatoes, minted peas, carrots and rice. After a rum-infused palate cleanser of punch romaine (the sixth course), quests moved on to roasted squab (pigeon) with wilted cress, asparagus salad with Champagne saffron vinaigrette and pâté de foie gras with celery. To round off that fateful meal, there was Waldorf pudding, peaches in Chartreuse jelly, chocolate and vanilla éclairs, French ice cream, assorted fresh fruit and cheeses. Each course was accompanied by a different wine chosen to enhance the flavour of the rich dishes

Sally Invited Joe Jarick to give the club members a report on the early life of Donald Healey -

Donald Healey was born in Perranporth on the West coast of Cornwall on 3/7/1898. He passed away on 15/1/1988.

He applied to the Sopwith company for an apprenticeship, in those days you had to pay to do an apprenticeship the cost being 200.00 pounds per annum (Around A\$9,000 today).

He Joined the Royal Flying Corps and received his 'wings' (pilot's licence) in 1916 but unfortunately had a number of serious crashes, the last in 1917 which caused him to be invalided out.

After World War 1, with the financial help from his father he opened a garage in Perranporth – in those days there were very few spare parts for the variety of cars, many marques did not survive very long. Consequently many of the parts needed had to be manufactured on site in his basic workshop.

In 1921 he entered his first motoring competition with a stripped down Buick, a car he used in his car hire business, and raced it over the measured mile at a speed of 66 mph.

In 1931 he won the Monte Carlo Rally outright in an Invicta, coming second in 1932.

In 1933 he joined the Riley Company, transferring to Triumph a year later.

In 1937 he became the technical officer at Triumph progressing to General Manager.

During World War 2 he worked for Claudel Hobson on carburettors for aero engines. Later joining the Humber Company, on the 'fighting vehicle' side, in 1946 he opened his own company, the Donald Healey Motor Company in Warwick, to manufacture the 'Healey' Car.

Then in 1952 he developed the Healey 100, which due to it being an overnight sensation on its release, was taken over by the Austin Motor Company and released as the Austin Healey 100. As they say the rest is history!
