

One Brush blew a tyre and was back on the road in 20 minutes.


One Brush stranded, run out of fuel. (Lucky I was soon along with my spare jerry can of fuel.)


We are all looking forward to 2025 with the next Brush Rally planned to be in Albany with Jane and Bernie McCallum the Directors.

The first vineyard was established in 1912 just outside Griffith, and the area has developed into a successful wine making region. In town, browse providores such as Riverina Grove and Bertoldo's Pasticceria for locally made delicacies and great coffee. Bertoldo's is an institution, a family bakery since 1952. The Griffith Italian Museum is in the Pioneer Park Museum, which spans over 30 historic buildings. For art lovers, the Griffith Regional Art Gallery has impressive collections.

#### A BLAST FROM THE PAST.

I wonder how many of our present Members were on this National Rally of which Kevin was Rally Organizer? This report appeared in the now defunct *Classic Motorist,* Issue 2. (We were one of the Renaults mentioned below .......Ed.)

# From September 1 until September 9 1998, the Queensland Branch of the V.C.C.A. hosted the National All Veteran (ie. pre-1919) Vehicle Rally in the Cooloola Shire of Queensland.

A hub rally based at Gympie, administrative and commercial centre of the Shire, saw approximately 100 of Australia's finest early cars and motorcycles venturing out each day to various local attractions.

Daily trips through the picturesque countryside were punctuated by numerous stops at country halls for homemade pikelets, scones, strawberry jam and cream etc. Visits included Gympie Historical Museum, The Woodworks, Pomona's Majestic Theatre (the only original silent movie theatre still operating in Australia) and the country areas of Kin Kin, Imbil and Lake Borumba. One visitor from New Zealand dubbed it the "Meals on Wheels Rally".

Of major interest to the citizens of Gympie was the Gaslight Parade. The veteran vehicles "fired up" their acetylene gaslights and thrilled thousands with their sights and sounds as they drove and rode through the City Mall during Thursday night's shopping.

The weekend gave entrants a break from driving. Saturday saw them riding the Mary Valley Rattler, a recently restored steam train that travels between Gympie and Imbil. Passengers could once more experience coal dust in the eyes and on the seats! On Sunday while the vehicles were on display at the Gympie Showgrounds for the benefit of a charity, some entrants went by bus

to Harvey Bay for a whale watching experience. Even the whales were cooperative in what proved for those who weren't green, a rewarding experience.

From an organisational point of view, the event ran smoothly with local associations, businesses and even the weather being most reliable. Judging from the comments entrants made, the majority had an enjoyable time. May I, through this article, invite them and other veteran enthusiasts to join us again in Queensland in future events. We in Queensland look forward to joining fellow veteran motorists in New South Wales for Tour 2000.



## THE LADY DRIVER





Most early cars were open to the weather, and ladies who elected to go for a spin were forced to sacrifice elegance for comfort.

There were only 3 things to consider - keeping warm, dry, and how to breathe through choking dust.

Headwear was always a problem for the female motoriste. At first great hoods with two round lenses or a mica rectangle cut into them for vision enveloped women's heads. Later fashion houses competed to provide something with a little more panache.

Voluminous veils protected delicate faces of women passengers.

Lady drivers found peaked caps or turbans of fur were most comfortable and suitable, secured with long hatpins.

Women were advised not to wear silk or woolen gloves as these allowed no grip on steering wheels, and to dispense with rings and bracelets as the stones were loosened by the vibrations.

A hand mirror was also recommended as a lady's accessory. It was advised to have it handy in a pocket or on a ribbon – to occasionally hold up to see what was behind.

So - women were the force behind the "rear view "mirror!

The courageous young lady who would dare venture out unaccompanied in an automobile was advised to carry a small revolver.

The Ladies' Automobile Club was formed in Britain in 1904.


### **ARCHIVES REPORT**
